Iowa Precinct Atlas Consortium (IPAC)

The IPAC software and program was developed in 2008 under the guidance and direction of former Cerro Gordo County Auditor, Ken Kline. After witnessing his county's Precinct Election Officials (PEOs) struggle with enforcing the new election law which allowed Election Day voter registration (EDR). Ken Kline and a team of IT staff decided to develop an in-house e-pollbook software program to assist the PEOs with processing all types of voters on Election Day and Precinct Atlas was created. The software was first used for a Cerro Gordo County special election in 2009. Appropriate procedures for each voter casting a ballot using complex election laws are provided that determines a voter's eligibility, the correct polling location, update to their address and/or name, Election Day registrations, and furnishing provisional ballots, if necessary. It was in 2013 when the Iowa Precinct Atlas Consortium (IPAC) was formed through 28E agreements between counties to provide organizational structure and to purchase license distribution rights from Cerro Gordo County. IPAC is currently operational in eighty (81) counties at the extent and discretion of the County Auditor. Within the current membership there is a potential of Precinct Atlas pollbooks to be in 1,450 polling locations across Iowa.
