CICS Curriculum Year 1 (Odd years)

- Public Administration (Core)
 - Open Meetings/Open Records
 - Ethics
 - ► Human resources
 - Budgeting
 - ► County office functions/structure of county government
 - ► Parliamentary Procedure
- Local Issues(Electives)
 - CAFOs
 - Drainage districts
 - Master Matrix
 - Mental health and disability services

CICS Curriculum Year 2 (Even years)

- ► Leadership (Core)
 - ► Big picture topics
 - Motivational
 - Creating culture
- Community Development and Outreach (Electives)
 - Best practices
 - ► Economic development
 - ▶ Public relations and communications
 - Working with municipalities

CICS Education Committee

- Seven committee members
 - Serve alternating two-year terms (no term limit)
 - Chair and committee members chosen by ISACS president, ratified by ISACS Executive Board
 - ► Chair a member of the ISACS Executive Board (ISACS bylaws amendment required)

CICS Education Committee

- Committee Member Duties
 - ▶ Plan programming one to two years in advance
 - Promote the program using marketing materials and communications
 - Chair to sit on ISACS Executive Board and provide committee updates
- Committee Member Qualifications
 - One committee member from each ISACS district
 - Actively pursuing or current CICS
 - Strive for sex, age, and county population balance
