2024 Legislative Recommendations Review and Approval - Mark Campbell

Jamie briefed everyone on new members of the Supervisors Legislative Committee

He reviewed legislative statements on home rule and state mandates and funding of local services

Top 4 objectives

Eminent domain 90 percent participation before it could be utilized, but was shut down

Juvenile detention funding-based on drivers license reinstatement fees presently. Nothing has transpired to date. It would be changed from fees to direct appropriation out of the state general fund.

It was brought up by the audience to increase beds due to over crowding. Proposed to base bed days for lowa kids, not outside state juveniles.

Amended motion by Don Kass, Plymouth County to look at increasing bed numbers and distributed contribution for lowa kids.

Second by Dave Muhlbauer, Crawford County

Motion carried

Medicaid funding-new this year, but a number of the issues are preexisting. Medicaid rates need adjusted up.

Motion by Richard Young, Washington County modify to Medicaid funding to include extra services.

Second by Crystal McIntyre, Warren County.

Ayes all nays none

4th lowa natural resources and water quality-modifications to funding of the trust fund, the method to do so has been a challenge. Penny statewide has been discussed in the past. State would have to back fill. We will be in strong support for a funding trust. Watershed management coordinator funding was also discussed. We need boots on the ground for flood mitigation statewide. This would be another resource for that.

Jamie-Policy statements-Broadband, County mandates to district court security, EMA funding and EMA Governance-Supervisors would like to have control of the funding/levee authority to fund EMA, Lucas-Forest and reserve-Lucas stated we have a policy statement on forest reserve, we are ranked 48-49 on public land-where can we find a compromise to bring in funding for the loss of property tax but the program is quite valuable, Dale House, van Buren County stated a problem he has is the highest deer licenses in the state and they are seeing a growing percentage of land purchased by out of state owners/hunters. Is there some way for out of state landowners to have property in the state of lowa. Lucas state no policy statement on this but will protect the southern tier. Steve Fulkerson, Decatur County-Can we break this into districts and have forest reserve. Lucas will get with Steve and discuss the use/misuse of the forest reserve policy. Mark suggested working with the DNR on this.

Lucas-Land Bank renamed to redevelopment trust-Branding move to gain support. Policy wise it is still the same.

Jamie-local government reform we oppose-sate level of HHS and realignment-no stakeholder input has been received yet. Jamie will be within this.

Mark-warren county-had discussion with his county attorney. Courthouses could become regional. Is it state reorganization or county reorganization. Jamie stated it would be a county reorganization effort.

MHDS-raised from 5 percent to 10 percent, but the issue died in session. Services required by state for services is driving the costs up. Governance boards were also discussed. Language has been added to 49 percent of governance board would be county supervisors. Push back from the state they're picking up the tab and want the control.

Lucas-RUTF 2015 gas tax increase but haven't heard much the past eight years to take it on again. Alternatives and other ways to contribute to RUTF are being looked at. Heavier equipment brings quicker deterioration to our county roads. No changes are up yet, but he will keep advocating for the counties.

Bob Yoder-Washington County -proposal for fuel tax on died fuel. Is there a way that those paying will see it in their communities? There is not a lot of conversation, but we keep advocating for it.

Steve Fulkerson-Decatur County-We need another sales tax on fuel.

Carol Vinton, Mills County-electric cars vs gas cars. No details have been discussed for county support.

Jerry Muilenburg-Sioux County-the state is no helping us out on 12 percent over weight limits. Jamie thinks there will be proposals to remedy this.

Lucas-property tax-new tax bill passed this year. We have not rewritten policy tax statement yet-it's a work in progress. We will keep long standing suggestions to legislators-ag/decoupling/taking ag buildings out of formula will remain. On going discussion on local level, funded and unfunded mandates, limiting property tax. It is a work in progress.

Jamie-Open meetings-flexibility by electronic meetings

Discussion on open meetings, recording meetings, and recording all meetings to be provided to public.

Motion to amend striking the whole open meeting item by Heather Stancil-Madison County

Second Tom Broeker, Des Moines County

Discussion-Bill Leupold, Dickinson County-Zoom can be misused and also can be handy to have. Tom Schultz, Lee County-Zoom has increased attendants and would like to keep the Zoom tool. Linda Murken, Story County-saw conflicting opinions on Zoom, quorum or not? Regional boards, etc. is it a quorum or not? She favors in-person meetings. Zoom and both in person meetings for access to participate.

Crystal McIntyre, Warren County-does both Zoom and live stream. Disabled citizens have utilized Zoom meetings and is in favor expanding electronic meetings as well as having the supervisor in person.

Amended motion again same Heather Stancil, Madison County by electronic and in person required for all sub boards and board

Tim Schumacher added that members of the court house and communities

Amended motion again to require one supervisor be present and to require all subcommittee meetings be recorded

Lisa Heddens, Story County does both zoom and in person. Links on line, etc. has seen increase in attendees due to Zoom.

Steve Kelsay, Winneshiek County-Records to be maintained forever, how do we justify keeping them on YouTube or in our own systems. Donna Robinson-agrees this would be problematic to add all other different boards who do not have the capabilities to offer both options.

Lucas-current proposal moved to objective to proposal. Legislature doesn't think the change is necessary to open it up move. Policy statement was not going to be drafted. Lucas offered for each county to document meetings as they see fit. Look at what you can do with your own authority.
