

Centralized Intake – Continuum of Care Board

Community-Based Crisis Stabilization

For families who need therapy and skill building in the home for up to five days

Available 24/7/365

Arrives within 120 minutes from dispatch



23 Hour Crisis Observation Center

For adults who need a safe place to go but do not meet criteria for hospitalization


Open 24/7

Crisis Stabilization Center

• For individuals who need more than 23 hours for crisis stabilization. May access for up to 5 days.







