

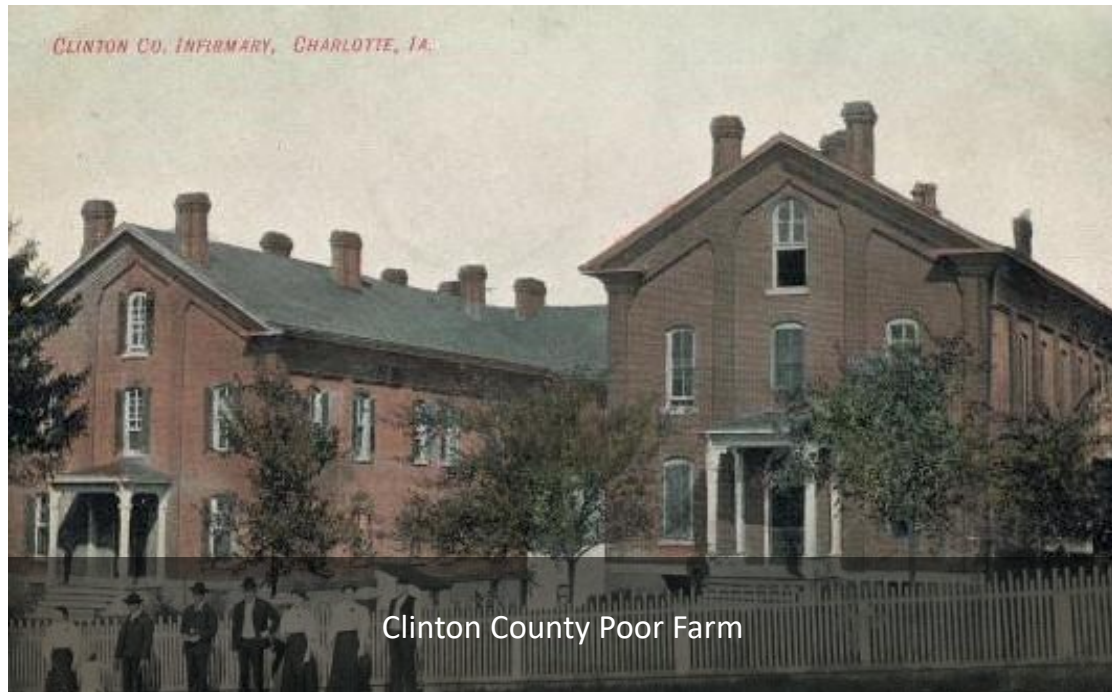

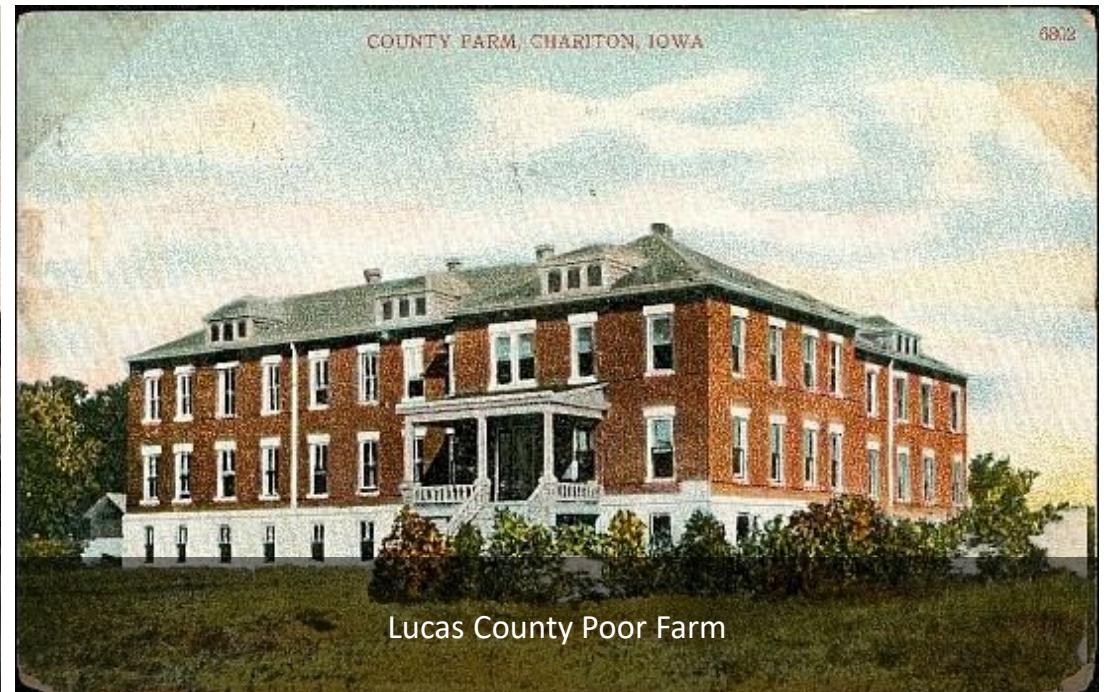

- 1963 – Community Mental Health Construction Act – federal grants available to states to establish local community mental health centers.
- 1970's – Deinstitutionalization
- 1995 – Central Point of Coordination (CPCs)
- 2014 – Regions
- 2016 – Iowa privatized Medicaid - Managed Care Organizations

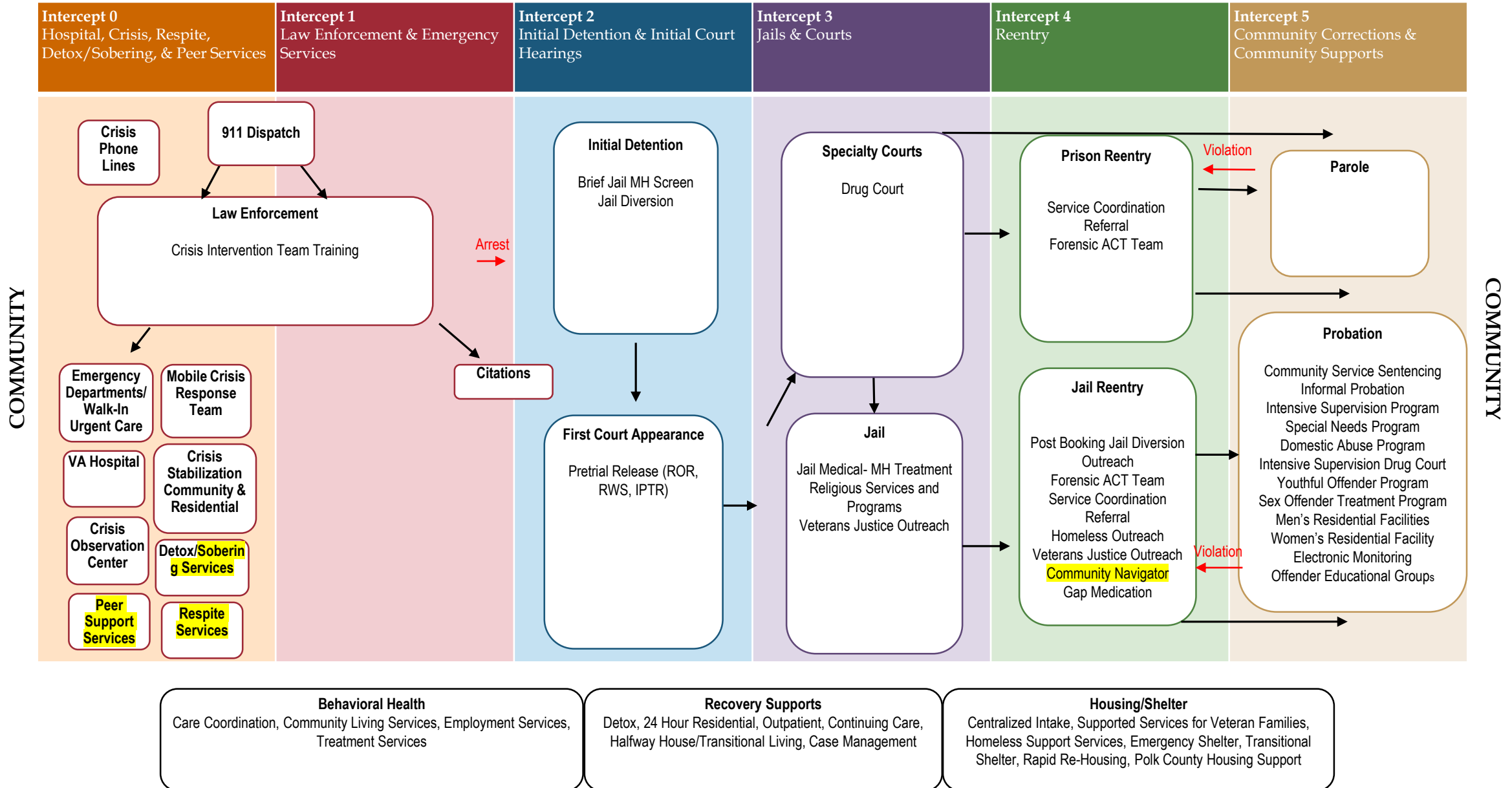

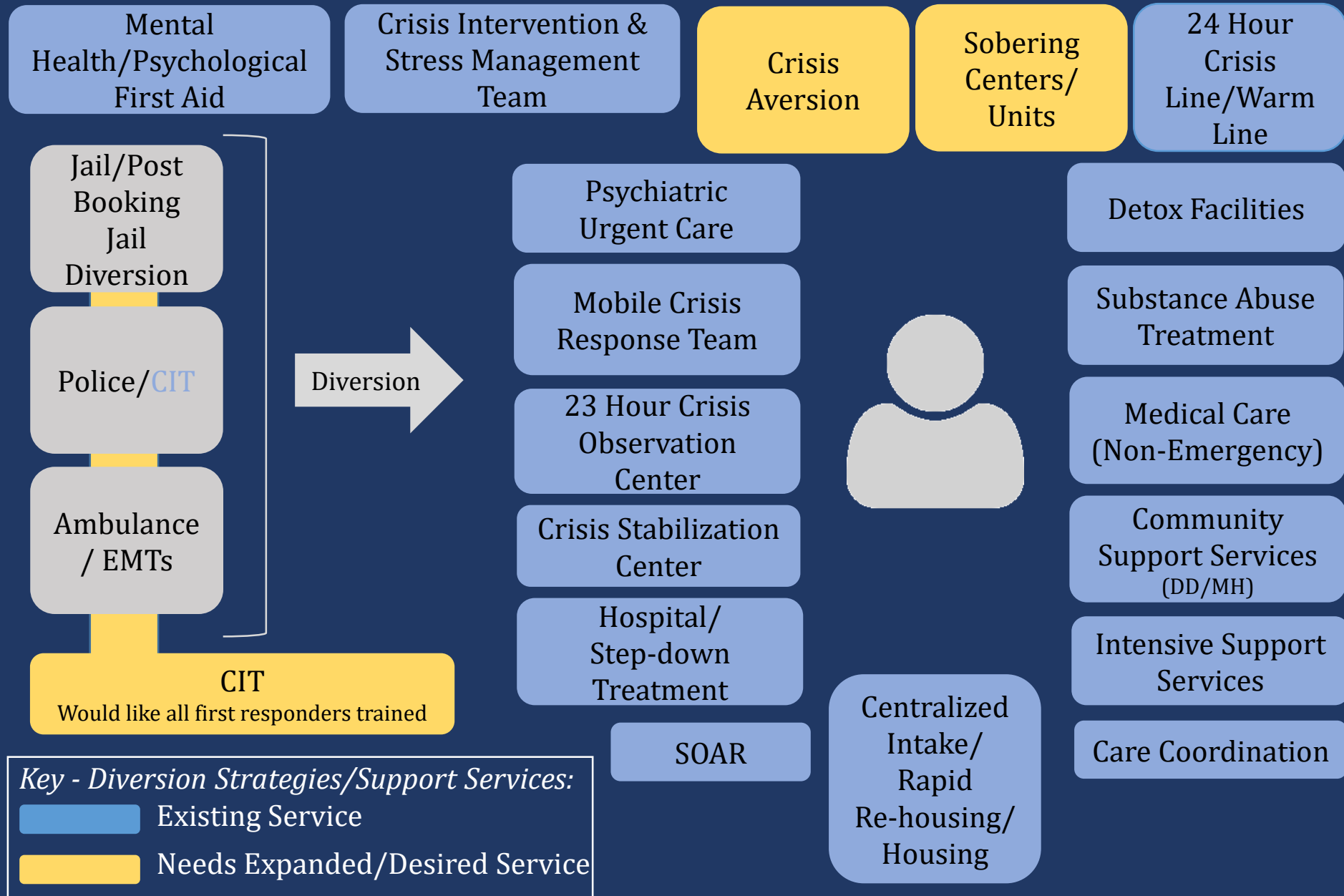

Individuals Experiencing Homelessness

Centralized Intake – Continuum of Care Board

Community- Based Crisis Stabilization

For families who need therapy and skill building in the home
for up to five days

Available 24/7/365

Arrives within 120 minutes from dispatch



23 Hour Crisis Observation Center

For adults who need a safe place to go but do not meet criteria for hospitalization

Open 24/7

Crisis Stabilization Center

- For individuals who need more than 23 hours for crisis stabilization. May access for up to 5 days.

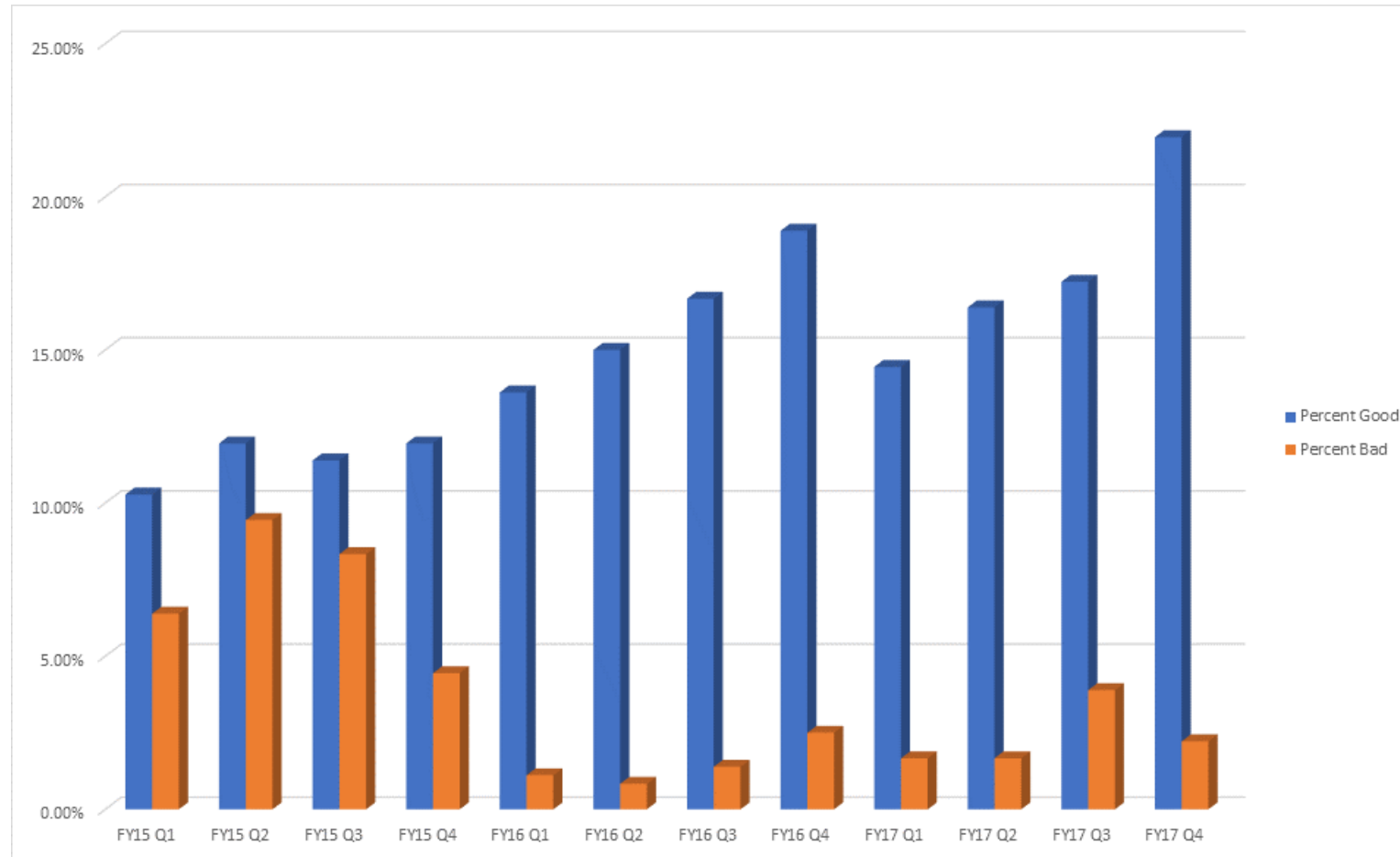

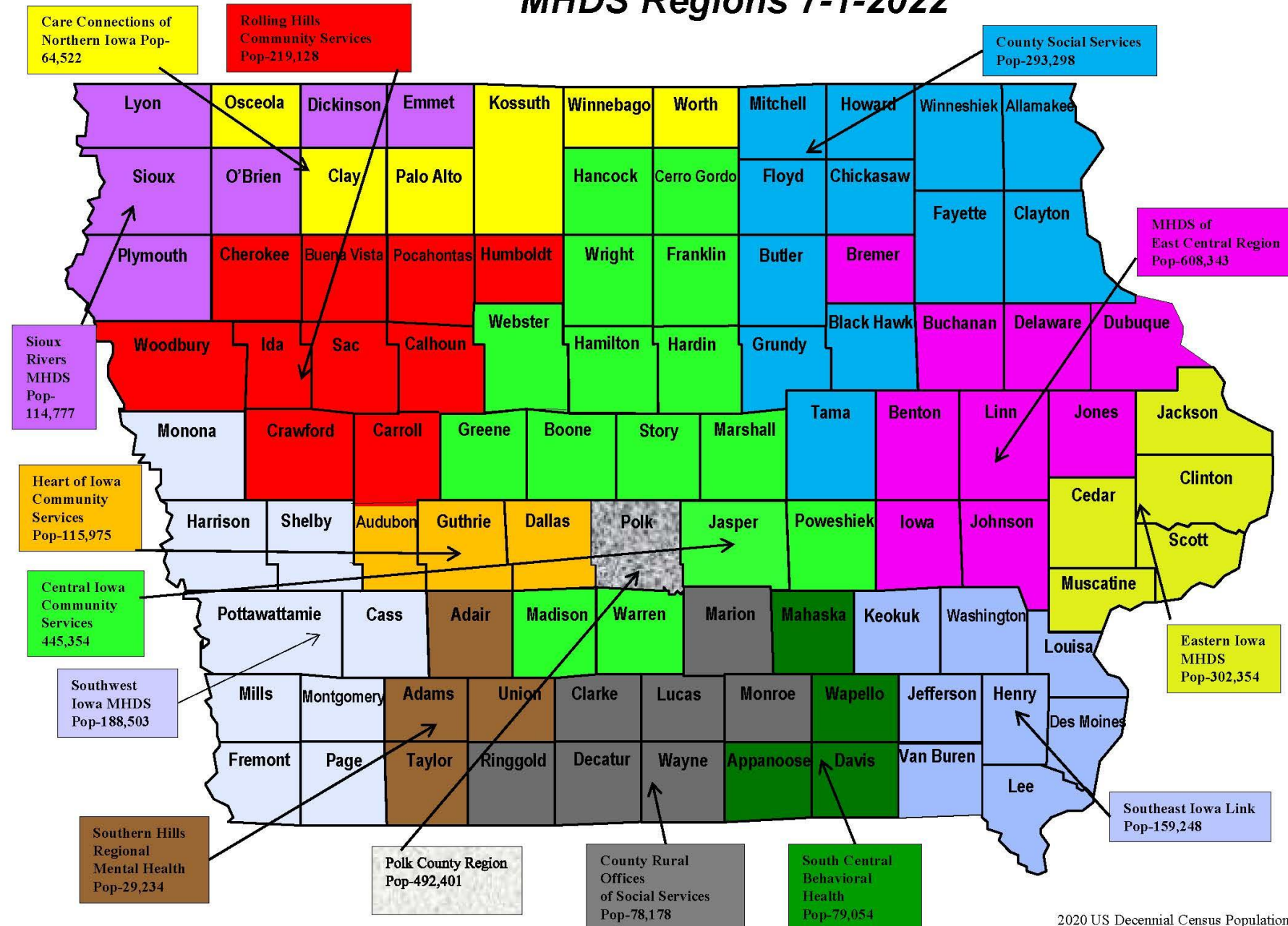
